Smart Specialisation Strategy (RIS3)

Each EU region has a Smart Specialisation Strategy defining priority areas for investment in research and innovation and guiding how EU and regional funds are allocated to support economic transformation and innovation.

If your technology is aligned with a RIS3 priority, you have a much higher chance of finding targeted regional funding calls.

EU Co-financed programmes within the EU Cohesion Policy

EU Cohesion Policy is the EU's main investment policy to reduce regional disparities and support economic, social and territorial development across Europe. It works by channeling EU funds into regions and Member States, where the money is then used to support projects aligned with EU priorities. Rather than being managed directly by the European Commission, Cohesion Policy funds are implemented at national and regional level. EU co-financed programmes are, therefore, the main implementation tools of Cohesion Policy.

It supports innovation and SMEs by strengthening regional competitiveness and funding pilots, demonstrations, scale-up activities and applied innovation.

It supports environmental and infrastructure investments in eligible Member States with lower income levels.
